2022 was the 'Year of the Volunteer' for Lake Humane Society. While team transitions occurred, the efforts and the support of the amazing LHS Volunteers kept operations smooth and our animal populations well cared for.

We saw another year of increased Humane Investigations and more rescued animals provided with safe and loving families. Our foster program was busy as well, clocking in at over 17,000 hours of volunteer effort and care. That translates to 708 full foster days and 587 fostered animals.

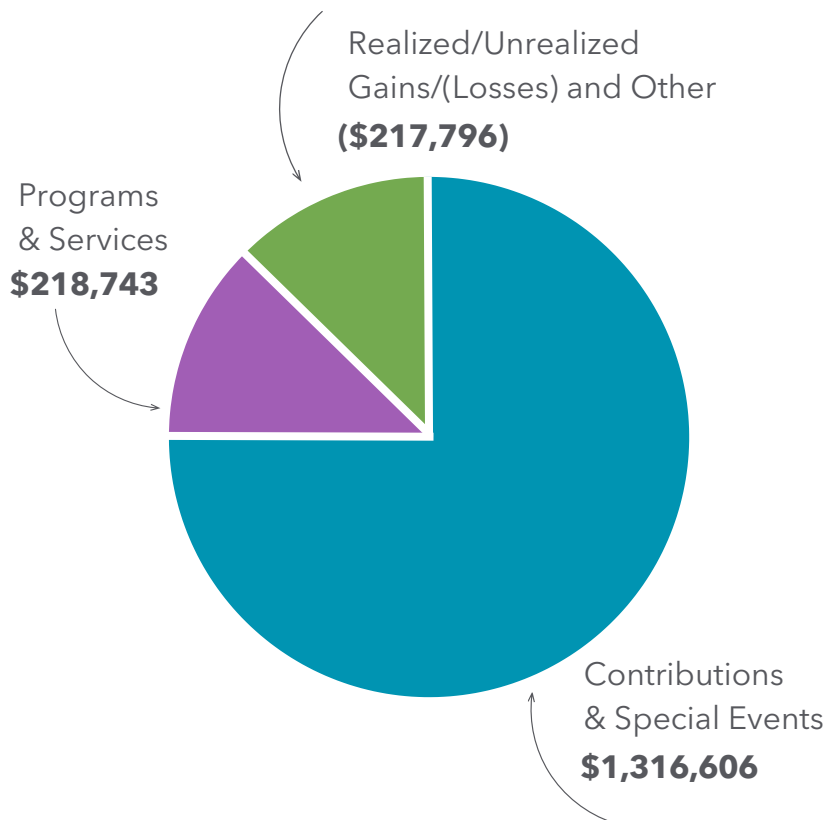

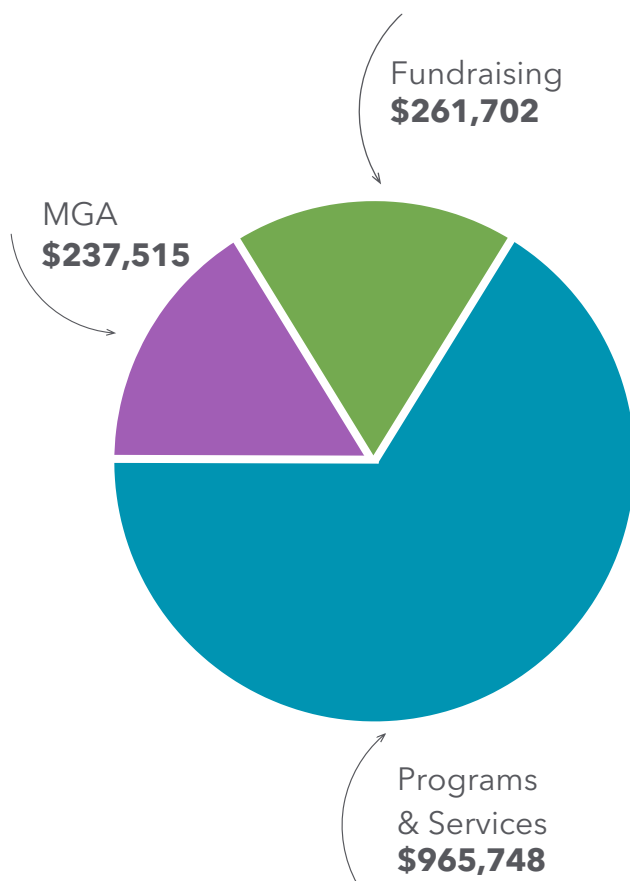
## REVENUE

# Angel Fund

## *Leo's Story*



Lake Humane Society Angel Fund enables us to provide medical care to all homeless animals, regardless of expense. One Angel Fund recipient that stood out to us this year was Ice, now named Leo by his adoptive mom.

Leo was found roaming the streets of Northeast Ohio with an injured leg that needed to be amputated. He was brought to us from Animal Welfare League of Trumbull County through our transfer program.
